Start of the Vagabond Winter Series

The first races of the Winter Series for our off-the-beach sailing boats commenced last Sunday. With the high tide not peaking until 2:45pm there was a leisurely start to the day and no need of an early morning start. (Certainly a luxury in the cooler winter months.)

It was a glorious sunny winter's day and we all felt blessed to be out on the water. The breeze blew as predicted at about 8 knots from a SE to E direction.

Four Vagabonds nominated for the races.

Peter Deane and Debbie Phillips sailed in Vagabond 4 while Ian Waller-Wilkinson and Sue Peterson sailed in Vagabond 6. Kerry Otter and Peter Fox sailed together in Vagabond 2 and Craig Berridge sailed his first races as skipper with Moss Lane as crew in Vagabond 5.

Race 1

The first race had the fleet sailing southward towards the Garden Island red beacon. Craig and Moss had wandered away a little from the start line and with only a light breeze to get them back, were late for the start. That gave the other three Vagabonds a good head start. It was close sailing and tactics were in play to cover each other and steal what little breeze there was. It was a close reach up to the first mark and then a broad reach northward to a buoy set near Iron Stem. The three leading boats stayed close together. On rounding the northern buoy it was close haul sailing back to the pontoon and the finish line. Peter D and Debbie led the way and crossed the line in first place. There was a near photo finish for second and third place with Peter F and Kerry only 6 seconds ahead of Ian and Sue.

Races 2 & 3

All four boats were keen for a second and then a third race. Craig and Moss made sure that they hung close and handy to the start line. Sailing conditions for the next two races remained the same as per the first race. Craig and Moss showed improved times with each race. The boats sailed closely together with fierce but friendly competitiveness. This was especially true when it came to rounding the course marks. So much so, that there was a collision between two boats at the Garden Island beacon.

There was one concerning moment however when a very large cruiser came charging up the channel and swept past our little boats at very close quarters without any care or concern for us. There was no change of speed and they seemed oblivious of us. No sign of a real seaman aboard that boat!

Results for scratch and handicap places are summarised later in this newsletter.
