# JUBILEE QUEENSLAND STATE TITLES Hosted by TINGIRA BOAT CLUB, Macleay Island, Moreton Bay.

Following postponement at Easter due to Covid19 restrictions, the Queensland Jubilees were able to enjoy their first ever state championships over the weekend 19/20 September 2020.

Not only was this event a first for the Jubilees (all nine of whom competed), but also for Macleay Island's Tingira Boat Club who had never previously conducted a sailing championship of any description. This little volunteer run club put in a sterling effort to ensure an exceptionally well-run event.

The club, situated on the western shores of Macleay Island in southern Moreton Bay, has a beautiful white sandy beach at high tide, but beyond this, a large expanse of sticky mud is exposed as the tide recedes. Although the Jubilees were all moored on temporary moorings in deep water, the need for beach access for crew dinghies, safety boats etc, necessitated that racing each day be conducted within a 3 to 4-hour tide window. Accordingly, a one-hour time limit was applied to each race to ensure the six-race series could be completed within the two days.

The course selected was a windward/return "sausage" with the fleet required to pass through the mid-course start line "gate" on both up and downwind legs.

Day one, unfortunately, saw the moderately fresh breeze swing to due east prior to the start of race 1, resulting in a fair amount of reaching on the roughly north/south course. With such a restricted time window, it was decided not to reset the course for a true windward/return (perhaps not ideal for a championship event, but much easier on the small band if dedicated officials). However, the offshore (from the island) breeze was

constantly shifting in both direction and strength, necessitating constant, diligent sail trimming from all crews.

Bruce Legg's beautifully prepared *Isobel* J124 performed exceptionally well in these conditions, achieving first place in all three, day 1 races. He and his crew were kept honest though, by both Alison Early, skippering Dave Gemmell's *Andiamo* J136, with a 2,4,3, and John King in *Lyla* J125, with a 5,2,2. In fact, in race 2, *Isobel* beat *Lyla* by less than a second, with *Lyla* having led the whole race until the last metre or so.

For day 2, the then very light breeze had swung around to the north, providing a true windward/return course. In fact, a slight "dogleg" created by the need to pass through the start line gate, which was offset somewhat to the east of the line between windward and leeward marks, resulted in a shy spinnaker run from the top mark to the gate, followed by a gibe and a square run to the leeward mark.

Very light winds in race 4, combined with a strong adverse current for the upwind leg, necessitated the flying of the shortened course signal as the boats passed through the gate on the first downwind leg. Even then, only *Isobel* and *Andiamo* managed to finish within the one-hour limit, with the rest of the fleet scoring a DNF.

As the breeze had not freshened significantly for Races 5 & 6, the windward and leeward marks were brought in closer, and some exciting racing was experienced within the tightly bunched fleet, and with the lead changing at almost every mark.

However, with the exception of race 4, where *Andiamo* beat her by a minute or so, *Isobel* dominated by each finish, achieving an almost perfect 1,1,1,2,1,1 for the series. Second was *Andiamo* with a 2,4,3,1,3,3 and *Stella* J123 (Euan MacDonald) third with 3,3,4,DNF,4,2. One of the pre series favourites, John King in *Lyla* J123, who occupied equal second place at the end of day 1, had a disappointing DNF,7,6 on day 2, relegating him to 4<sup>th</sup> place overall.

All crews enjoyed the weekend immensely and were grateful for the wonderful hospitality and effort provided by the Tingira Boat Club. All were keen to repeat the exercise next year, and hoped that the eventual easing of travel restrictions will enable one or more southern Jubes, or at least their crews, to join us for that event. On that point it should be noted that of the nine boat local fleet, *Beverley* J83, the boat that started it all up here, is Dave Gemmell's second" boat; *Stella* is jointly owned by the three local wooden jubilee owners, Mike King *Nereid* J39, Tony Harland *Jason* J40 and Dave Gemmell *Andiamo* and *Beverley*; and Ron Letheren, who owns *Sarina Lee* is no longer fit enough to sail her but is happy to loan her. For this series it was necessary to hunt pretty hard for skippers and crews for these vessels, so there should always be a boat available for crews wishing to make the trip north.

Results for each race and overall were published in last week's newsletter, together with photos provided by TBC commodore Neville Prosser, whose multi-tasking ability enabled him to take these while officiating on the start/finish boat. Not surprisingly, there aren't any photos of the starts.

#### Stage 3 – Easing of Restrictions Plan

As of noon, July 3, 2020, the Queensland Government has eased the Corona Virus restrictions to Stage 3.

With all businesses allowed to open, this will allow Queensland to open up, so people can start to get back to normal; a new normal.

The most important thing that we must continue to observe is the Social Distancing rules: 1.5 meters between people and allowing, in most cases, 4 square meters per person.

So far Queensland has escaped a second wave of the Corona Virus because we have observed the restrictions laid down by our Government. If we continue to obey the rules, we will progress forward, and we will not finish up like Victoria.

#### **Our Club**

We shall continue to operate in line with the Industry COVID Safe Plan for Queensland Hotels and Clubs.

However, we still need to have our own Plan to cover our specific conditions and this is updated in the following information.

#### From Friday July 10 the following will apply:

- The main area and deck will be classed as one area rather than two as was required in Stage 2.
- Limitations of numbers: for areas less than 200 square meters, 2 square meters per person is allowed with a limit of 50 people. We can therefore seat up to 50 people on a Friday night.
- Members and their guests only.
- Bookings! Names on the white board. (Members and guests of members) No phone bookings except those not on Macleay Island.
- Seating as arranged. No extra chairs or tables to be added unless approved by the Commodore.

- Food will be served straight to tables.
- Dirty plates to be returned to the designated tables for collection by kitchen staff.
- Drinks may be purchased from the bar, however you must be seated to drink them.
- Follow the marks on the floor when in line to observe Social Distancing.
- Bar opening time 6.00 p.m. (Friday)
- Kitchen staff only in the kitchen.
- Follow marks on the floor while in line, when paying for your meal.
- Use credit/debit cards etc, instead of cash where possible.
- Names of those attending will have their names listed. As is customary, members in attendance, will have their addresses and mobile numbers readily available from Club register if required. Guests of members however will need to have listed their names, addresses/email address and telephone number.
- If you are ill, stay home, do not come to the Club.
- Download the COVID Safe App.
- Observe instructions from the Commodore and Management Committee members.

#### Courtesy Bus Ring Moss 0428 717 535

Observe Social Distancing Rules as instructed by the Driver.

Courtesy transport must be frequently cleaned and disinfected between uses.

Social distancing must be maintained as far as possible during use. A contact information list must be kept for members travelling on the bus for contact tracing purposes, including name, address, and telephone number for a period of at least 56 days.

#### **Boating**

Stage 3 has also opened sporting activities. From our perspective, we can open more of the boating side of our Club.

By aligning the Club with the Aquatic Sports Sector COVID Safe Plan we can extend our operations to Dragon Boats, x6 Outriggers (OC6) and Sailing Boats.

**OC6:** Six Paddlers.

Sailing Craft: Vagabonds. Two people per craft placed to observe Social

Distancing requirements.

- All personnel visiting the Club for any reason, regardless of if they are using the Clubs equipment or as a spectator must provide their name, address and mobile number which will kept at the Club for 56 days in case of a COVID-19 outbreak.
- A list of all paddlers in each boat to be kept for 56 days.
- Also, their destination and stopping points must be recorded.
- All shared equipment must be sanitised after each use.
- If you are ill, do not come to the Club.
- Observe Social Distancing at all times, 1.5meters.
- Download the COVID Safe App
- Provide sanitising stations
- Observe instructions from the Boating sub-committee and Management Committee members.

This plan may change from time to time as requirements are altered.
