Sailing Log - Learn to Sail - Sunday 21 March

The tide was unsuitable for sailing on Sunday and so it was a case of staying ashore and catching up with some sailing theory. This week we explored the topic 'how does a sailing boat work'.

Using diagrams, boat models and a fan we explored how the force of the wind on the sails and the water on the underparts of the boat (particularly the centreboard) combine to propel the boat through the water. Using the boat models and fan we also re-examined the points of sailing both upwind and downwind.

Then it was outside to have a practice rigging the boats - and we did this slowly with our beginners taking the lead and asking questions as they went.

Bells Mason suggested we develop a step-by-step checklist for rigging and unrigging the boats to assist in the learning process. A great idea and one will be developed during the week and road tested (or should we say sail tested) at next week's sailing lesson.

We will also aim at having both *Tango* and *Sandpiper* out on the water to keep an eye on things.

Combined Paddle and Sail - Easter Regatta

Planning is well underway for our first ever combined paddle and sail regatta. The course for the regatta will be a sausage shaped course set parallel to the western side of Macleay Island in close proximity to the Tingira Boat Club. The start and finish line will be from the pontoon which will be stationed directly out from the Club.

Bruce Legg is one of our Club's more enthusiastic and experienced sailors. He is regularly on hand each week to assist with the Club's 'Learn to Sail' program or compete in our Vagabond off-the-beach sailing races.

He also owns and races a Jubilee One-Design Class Yacht called *Isabel*. Bruce has sailed *Isabel* in several Calvert Memorial Sailing Events and in September last year won the inaugural Queensland Jubilee Championships hosted by the Tingira Club.

But that is not all - Recently, Bruce has taken up sailing each fortnight with the Historical 10 Foot Skiffs based at the Brisbane Sailing Squadron, Bulimba on the Brisbane River. Coincidentally, three other Tingira sailors, Alison Early, Mike King and John King are also sailing in the 10 footers. **Some quick facts:**

 10 Foot skiffs are 10 foot long and carry as much sail area as you are prepared to.

- They have wooden hulls with gaff/gunter sails and rigs.
- Sailed by a minimum crew of three.
- The class aims to preserve the history and the camaraderie that exists around these skiffs with hull, sails and rigging based on the 1940s & 1950s.

The fleet is currently preparing for the 2021 Historical 10ft Skiff Australian Championships to be held 1 - 3 May.

A trip is being planned by other Tingira sailors to pay a visit to Bulimba and view the sail racing on either the Saturday or Sunday of the Championships.

COVID 19 Restrictions - Recording of Attendees

The Queensland Government has tightened the methods of record keeping for hospitality businesses and clubs.

As on December 23, 2020 all hospitality businesses including clubs must record the names, mobile numbers and addresses of patrons electronically.

The Tingira Boat Club has derived a plan that will fulfil the requirements of the Government and of that of the club.

Friday Members Dinners (Members and their Guests only)

The Club's requirements:

As is our normal practice, names will be placed on the board outside the club door prior to 5:00 pm Thursday. (Limit of 60)

On Friday night the Treasurer or representative will collect payments for meal and list of names present on attendance sheet.

Government requirements:

A QR scanning system has been installed allowing members and their guests to scan on entry. These will be checked by treasurer or representative. Check in scans will be placed in the entry foyer.

Fish and Chips

The Club's requirements:

As is our normal practice, names will be placed on the board outside the club door prior to 5.00 pm Thursday. (Limit of 70)

On Friday night the Treasurer or representative will collect payments for meal and list of names present on attendance sheet.

Government requirements:

A QR scanning system has been installed allowing members and their guests to scan on entry. These will be checked by treasurer or representative. Check in scans will be placed in the entry foyer. Those unable to scan should seek assistance from a committee member. (A paper record can be taken if a patron does not have a smart phone as long as it is transferred to an electron system within 24 hours). All catering volunteers must also be registered.

Ticketed Functions

Tickets to be sold prior to the event, however an official will be stationed near the door to ensure QR scanning and ticket checking occurs to verify those in attendance. (A paper record can be taken if a patron does not have a smart phone as long as it is transferred to an electronic system within 24 hours). All catering volunteers must also be registered

Sunday on the deck

The only time that walk-in patrons are in attendance. They will be supervised by the Bar Staff and are required to register with QR scanning. Those unable to scan should seek assistance from staff.

(A paper record can be taken by volunteer cater if a patron does not

have a smart phone, as long as it is transferred to an electron system within 24 hours). All catering volunteers must also be registered.

Boating

All boaties must sign on to say they are out on the water on sign-on sheets. This will continue. They must QR scan if eating and/or drinking.
