

Tingira Start Sailing Session 20/04/21 - Capsizing

Our *Start Sailing* session last Sunday focused on 'How to Avoid Capsizing' and 'Capsize Recovery'.

The session began indoors with a theory segment on ways to avoid capsizing (both to leeward or windward) followed by what to do if you do capsize. The big tip for the session was 'Stay With The Boat'

Then it was outdoors to put theory into practice. Luckily for us it was in the middle of a bright sunny autumn day with very little breeze. The tide was a very low high tide (only 1.7m) so we had to wade out from the shore to find enough water to capsize and recover our Vagabond dinghy. Again we were in luck that we could walk out on the geo-fabric mat laid out in front of the Club and not sink too far into the boggy bay mud.

Ian Waller-Wilkinson, Peter Lawson and Peter Fox took the 'Start Sailing' crew through the steps involved in righting a capsized sailing dinghy. Bells Mason and Kim Snowdon were the first victims to give it a try and did an awesome job of braving the mucky water (and mud) and going through the recovery procedure several times.

Michael Larson and Jen Rush followed and did likewise.

Now that the procedure has been practiced in shallow water, the next step will involve doing the same procedure but in deeper water with a safety boat standing by. This will be arranged at a later date during the *Start Sailing* course.

A big ahoy! and thanks goes to Brian and Gail Spann of Bay Islands Marine Service for their very generous donation of a reel of 12mm polyester rope. The rope is quality marine grade and will be very handy to make replacement mainsheet ropes for our fleet of Vagabonds and also to provide tow ropes for our safety boats. With a long tow rope it is possible to tow a good number of Vagabonds together at the same time. This may be required in a rescue situation stemming from either too little wind (like a fortnight ago) or too much wind (say in a sudden storm). We will be practicing this manoeuvre in a few weeks time as part of our *Start Sailing* course. The rope will also make suitable tow ropes for the OC6

Queensland Check in App

The Queensland Government has made it mandatory that all pubs, clubs, restaurants and cafes in Queensland change to the Queensland Check-In App to allow attendees to register their presence electronically.

The Tingira Boat Club will switch to this form of QR recording as from Friday April 16, 2021.

All you need to do is:

- ✓ Download Queensland Check-In app from Google Play or Apple App stores
- ✓ enter your details once when you first open the app
- ✓ open the app when you next visit us
- ✓ select 'Check-in Now' and scan or enter our code

You only have to ever enter your details once.

You can use it at any venue using the Queensland Check-In App.

If you do not have a suitable smart phone, you can still enter your details on the sheets available which will be added electronically by staff later.

Using this digital check in means your details will be stored securely by the Queensland Government for 56 days to assist with COVID-19 contact tracing (if needed).

The Check-In Qld app is safe, secure and private. By using it, you are helping Queensland's pubs, clubs, restaurants and cafes to stay open, and you can visit us with confidence, knowing you can be contacted quickly and easily if there is any risk of exposure to the virus.
