Commencing Friday July 2, 2021

- Members Only (Friday night)
- All attendees must wear a mask until seated.
- Numbers restricted to 50.
- You must be seated while eating and drinking.
- Sign-in with Queensland Check-In App.

New restrictions for the Brisbane Area.

- Face masks: masks must be worn in indoor spaces where you can't
 physically distance. You must carry a face mask with you at all times
 whenever you leave your home unless you have a lawful reason not
 to.
- You must be seated when eating or drinking at a cafe or restaurant.
- Private gatherings: 30 people maximum including residents, visitors and children.
- All indoor settings: 1 person per 4 square metres or 100% capacity with ticketed and allocated seating
- Weddings: up to 100 people with 1 person per 4 square metres, limited to 20 people dancing at any one time
- Funerals: up to 100 people with 1 person per 4 square metres
- Residential aged care facilities, disability accommodation services and hospitals will have increased visitor restrictions.
